Перейдемо до роботи з текстом. У випадку з цим видом роботи все навпаки. Якісна робота з текстом передбачає багаторівневий аналіз, у тому числі граматичних, лексичних, стилістичних особливості тексту, його синтаксису, авторської думки тощо. Крім того, базуючись на інформацію з тексту викладач може скласти низку вправ, розрахованих на особисту взаємодію студентів. Таким чином, ця частина роботи потребуватиме значну частину аудиторного часу.

Щодо аудіювання, зазначимо, що наразі наявні в мережі Інтернет різні відтінки мовлення носіїв мови, можна користуватися нескінченним об'ємом оригінальних відео будь-якого формату, від навчальних до художніх фільмів, аналізувати тонкощі мови, що вивчається.

В цьому випадку все залежить від власних інтересів викладача та студентів. Зокрема, аудіювання, як і текст  $\epsilon$  своєрідним фундаментом для цілої серії усних завдань, обговорення, аналізу, діалогів, доречних для аудиторної роботи.

Отже, заняття з іноземної мови в аудиторії на сучасному етапі можуть бути повною мірою зосереджені на інтеграції отриманих студентами знань у конкретні навички усного та писемного мовлення, розуміння письмового та аудіо-тексту та моделювання різноманітних комунікативних ситуацій.
