FOREIGN LANGUAGE INTEGRATION IN HIGHER EDUCATION AND MEDIA: A STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK FOR UKRAINE'S POST-WAR INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

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Introduction. This article will explore how language proficiency contributes to the country's development, enhances education, shapes global perceptions through the media, and supports initiatives for recovery.

1. Foreign languages in higher education: transformative mechanisms for academic internationalization

Academic environments are essential hubs for developing the expertise and leadership required to advance Ukraine's reconstruction. Incorporating foreign languages into academic curricula enhances students' cross-cultural competencies and cultivates essential global networking capacities. Ukrainian universities should prioritize delivering a comprehensive foundation of knowledge as a core component of their academic programs, rather than viewing it as an afterthought. To accomplish this, it is crucial to implement a structured language-learning system that ensures every student has the opportunity to learn at least one foreign language from the beginning. The most effective method involves integrating language instruction with the main subject matter, such as offering specialized courses in foreign languages. International academic mobility programs and research partnerships with foreign institutions provide Ukrainian students and educators with valuable opportunities for professional development. These collaborative frameworks should include bilateral exchange agreements with leading research centers and joint scientific consortia that focus on addressing challenges related to post-war reconstruction [2, p. 8].

Mastering English and other strategically selected foreign languages is essential for career advancement in today's globalized economy. This language proficiency enables Ukrainian graduates to enter competitive international job markets and engage in multinational research projects. Consequently, modern Ukrainian educators emphasize that effective foreign language teaching in a distance learning format, particularly during martial law, necessitates a comprehensive approach that integrates both technological and psychopedagogical factors [3, p. 685].

2. Media and language as strategic instruments of international influence Media plays a vital role in presenting Ukraine to the world. It is essential to utilize various languages in media communications to effectively convey information to an international audience and combat misinformation.

New products and videos from diverse digital platforms allow audiences around the globe to access accurate information about Ukraine's transformation. To achieve this, it is important to leverage modern digital technologies and diversify content across different platforms.

Clear documentaries and cultural programs in foreign languages help Ukraine strengthen its connections with the world and gain support. Collaborating with popular international media outlets also enhances the credibility of the information about Ukraine and expands its reach. As is argued by Yu. Postupaka: «One of the key tasks of Ukraine becoming a successful European state and a full member of the European Union is the modernization of the national higher education system in the context of the problems caused by the war and its focus on accelerating integration into the EU, which should be implemented based on coordinated actions of state administration bodies to ensure socio-economic development, health care, language, and culture» [4, p. 9].

3. International Cooperation and Strategic Frameworks for Language Policy

To effectively integrate foreign languages in Ukraine, it is essential to foster collaboration among the government, educational institutions, and businesses. The language policy should align with European standards, which involve allocating funds for educational infrastructure and adopting international language learning frameworks, such as the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. This approach will enable Ukrainians to enhance their proficiency in foreign languages.

Moreover, it is crucial to invest in modern language learning technologies and advanced training programs. These investments will help prepare specialists who can contribute effectively to key sectors involved in the country's reconstruction. [5, p. 55].
